PHONICS:

Children are now practising reading words containing all the sounds we have learnt. Over the coming weeks they will also be introduced to this final set of tricky words: said, have, like, so, do, some, come, were, there, little, one, when, out, what.

MATHS:

We will be looking at the concept of time by sequencing events and using words such as, now, next, later, before. We will also be looking at different ways of representing and sorting 9 and 10.

LITERACY:

Children will write mini Supertato books and practise reading and writing tricky words.

Although the weather has been rather unsettled the children have settled back into the routines of school excellently.

They have thoroughly enjoyed listening to Supertato stories and taking part in related activities. They especially enjoyed helping Supertato escape from the ice after Evil Pea made his way into the freezer.

We will continue learning on Supertato next week, as well as further learning on freezing and melting and the concept of real life superheroes.

The children will also learn about Shrove Tuesday as we begin learning about the importance of Easter to some Christians.
