REMINDERS

PHONICS:

We will be revisiting the 'ure' and 'er' sound and focussing on learning to read and write the tricky words; what, out, when, were

MATHS:

The children will be investigating the pattern of numbers beyond 20 and meet the number 100!

They will select, rotate and manipulate shapes to develop spatial reasoning skills.

LITERACY:

The children will use the story of Rainbow Fish to create a story map and write parts of the story. This will then lead on to recycling the story, next week, using their own ideas. We will continue to be focusing on sentence writing and the correct formation of letters.

The children continue to work and play hard and keep on impressing us with all their effort and enthusiasm.

We have been learning all about Rainforests over the past two weeks and finding out about the vast variety of animals and plants that exist there. We have also talked about how important it is that these environments are protected.

We then had a walk around the school nature area and talked about how the woodland environment compares to that of a rainforest.

We will now be diving into the ocean and looking at the wonderful world that exists beneath the waves. The children will be making an underwater scene using a shoebox. If you have any empty shoe boxes at home we would really appreciate all donations! Ideally these need to be in school by Wednesday morning.

Homework is concentrating on sentence writing. The children are doing so well in this area but with practice at home they will become even more confident and independent. We have put more information about how to help your child with the activity, in their homework books.
