
Lollipop Kate

Respectful Driving and Parking

The beginning of the new school year is always a good time to remind everyone who drives their child to school or picks them up about the expectations that we have as a school to keep the local community, all of you and your children as safe as possible. Following conversations already this term with our local Police Officers, who will be visiting the school site on a randomised basis at drop off and pick up, please can we ask the following of everyone:

- Follow the one way system of driving through the school site from Stuart Drive and out onto Holdbrook.
- To not use the school car park as an area to drop your child off as adults are not present in the car park and this puts your child in potential danger from other moving cars as they walk to one of the gates that they need to use to access the school each morning.
- Park responsibly and considerately, for example not parking on or across someone's driveway.
- Any parents/carers parking in the school site to pick their child up from the Rising Stars wraparound club to ensure that you do not block staff cars in. If this is not possible, then please park responsibly outside of the school grounds.

We appreciate that parking is difficult in the local area at drop off and pick up time and we appreciate your support with this.
