

This might of course be a signal that something is not quite right and needs further investigation, but it could also mean that they are simply exhausted and in need of the upcoming half term break. Please try to bear this in mind this week and if your child is struggling, then please reassure them that there is just one week to go and that they can do this!




# Shoebox Appeal 2023

### LITERACY:

Next week we will continue looking at autumn themed stories and sharing our ideas and opinions. We will also introduce the children to some poetry.



The children have had a fantastic week and are now experts in 1, 2 and 3. We've talked a lot about what the numbers look like and the way they can be shown. We have also been using the vocabulary of; 'more', 'fewer' and 'subitising' (to identify the number of things in a set simply by quickly looking at themnot by counting them one by one).

We've done some fabulous learning about autumn and will continue to look at the world around us and how it changes through the seasons. We have been out on an autumn walk and talked about all the signs we can see. If you have time over the week, it would be great if you could do this too and maybe send us an 'autumn photograph' or picture that your child has created in response to being 'out and about'.
